

SMALL SHAWL

a shawl for little ones

A small shawl is a triangular shawl worked flat from the top down with I Cord edge.

It's an easy project for beginner. It's perfect to use leftover yarn.

INFORMATIONS

It can be worked with a buttonhole row or with a push button- it's your choice.

You can use every type of yarn: in my examples I used Madelinetosh dk weight. But a sports or aran weight is possible too.

MATERIALS

20gr of yarn in dk weight (in my examples I used Madelinetosh dk)

US 7 / 5 mm needles

Stitch markers, tapestry needle, one button or pushed- button (I used a Kam Snap)

ABBREVIATIONS

Co = cast on

sts = stitches

k = knit

m = marker

m1 = Lift the horizontal strand between stitches with the left needle. Knit through the loop.

K2tog = knit 2 stitches together

Yo = yarn over

Pm = place marker

Sl m = slip marker

Inc = increase



INSTRUCTIONS WITH PUSHED BUTTON

The shawl is knitted in Garter Stitch. CO 3 sts and knit all sts for 6 rows. After last row, do not turn work, but pick up and knit 3 sts down the left side of the fabric (one stitch in each garter ridge), then pick up and knit 3 sts in CO edge (one stitch in each CO stitch) – 9 sts on your needle.



Next row (WS): k4, pm, k1, pm, k4

Row 1 (RS): *k1, m1*twice, k to m, sl m, m1, k1, m1, sl m, k to last 2sts, *m1, k1*twice (6sts inc)

Row 2: (WS): k all

Repeat Row 1 and 2 until you have the desired length. In my examples I repeated row 1 and 2 twelve times. Knit one more row (only RS)

Now it's time for the i-cord bind off. Cast on 3 more sts and knit 2 stitches. Slip the next stitch knitwise, then knit one stitch and passed the slipped stitch over the knit one. Insert the left needle from left to right into the three stitches we've just knit and slip those stitches back to the left needle. Repeat these steps until you only have three stitches and bind off them.

Cut the yarn and sew the ends.

Now you can put the pushed button.



INSTRUCTIONS WITH BUTTONHOLE

The shawl is knitted in Garter Stitch. CO 3 sts and knit all sts for 6 rows. After last row, do not turn work, but pick up and knit 3 sts down the left side of the fabric (one stitch in each garter ridge), then pick up and knit 3 sts in CO edge (one stitch in each CO stitch) – 9 sts on your needle.

Next row (WS): k4, pm, k1, pm, k4

Row 1 (RS): *k1, m1*twice, k to m, sl m, m1, k1, m1, sl m, k to last 2sts, *m1, k1*twice (6sts inc)

Row 2: (WS): k all

Repeat Row 1 and 2 until you have the desired length but remember that you must work a buttonhole row. In my examples I repeated row 1 and 2 eleven times.

Then I worked the buttonhole row as follows:

(RS): *k1, m1*twice, k to m, sl m, m1, k1, m1, sl m, k to last 6 stst, k2tog, yo, k2, *m1, k1*twice.

WS: k all

Knit one more row (only RS)

Now it's time for the i-cord bind off. Cast on 3 more sts and knit 2 stitches. Slip the next stitch knitwise, then knit one stitch and passed the slipped stitch over the knit one. Insert the left needle from left to right into the three stitches we've just knit and slip those stitches back to the left needle. Repeat these steps until you only have three stitches and bind off them.

Cut the yarn and sew the ends.
